Creative Cauldron Announces 2017-18 Theatrical Season at *ArtSpace Falls Church*

Falls Church, VA – The 2017-18 Season will mark **Creative Cauldron’s** ninth year producing and presenting live theater and music at *ArtSpace Falls Church*. The season includes a diverse range of programming for adults and families alike. Highlighting the season will be a world premiere musical, *Witch* written by internationally produced duo Stephen Gregory Smith and Matt Conner. *Witch* is the fourth installment of Creative Cauldron’s five-year “Bold New Works for Intimate Stages” initiative. The season’s theatrical offerings are complemented by live music throughout the year by two concert series: the “Passport to the World Festival” and the “Summer Cabaret Series.” Tickets are on-sale now, and can be purchased by visiting www.creativecauldron.org or calling 703-436-9948. ***The Mistress Cycle* (October 5 – October 29, 2017)**

Jezebel, Siren, Vixen or Enchantress? *The Mistress Cycle* tells the story of five women: Tess, a struggling 30-something Manhattan photographer; Anais Nin, the famed sexual adventuress of the early 20th century; Diane de Poitiers, the mistress of Henri II in France in the 16th century; Lulu White, a turn-of-the-last-century New Orleans Madame; and Ching, a 14-year-old concubine in 12th century China. Though they come from different times and cultures, they share a sisterhood. An intelligent new musical work filled with stories of passion, compromise, heartbreak and renewal.

Helen Hayes Award Winning Actress, Iyona Blake (Caroline or Change) returns to the Cauldron to portray one of America's most iconic jazz legends. In March of 1959, Billie Holiday performed one of her final shows in a run-down bar in South Philly. "Lady Day," as she was called, turned jazz songs and standards into searching, and searing, portraits of life and love gone wrong. And this final performance wove together over a dozen of her most salty, and often humorous, numbers ("When a Woman Loves a Man," "Taint Nobody's Business If I Do," "Pig Foot and a Bottle of Beer," for a riveting portrait of the woman behind the legend.
